At the annual conference in Braunfels in June, I was again assigned to work in the Recklinghausen community. Actually, my term of service would have ended this summer. But we sat together in the church leadership and considered whether it wouldn't make sense for the work of the church if I extended it for another 2 years. This is possible because God has given me good health in addition to a great church and because the superintendents and bishop have also agreed to it.

I attached the condition to my extension that we as a church start at least one new project with which we reach people who need God's care and love. This includes the service for people with dementia changes and their relatives, which we will start in autumn. And we want to offer regular, low-threshold care for people with dementia and a family café.

Something is also happening in the area of working with children. The children at our Trial tents were there, would like to experience that more often and also the kids with the Cooking courses want a continuation. And the employees enjoy it.

It would be great if we could find someone with scouting experience. Then we could offer a regular scout meeting once a month.



What worries us in church leadership is finances. In the last few years, some of our older siblings have died, and I have reported about this again and again in the parish newsletter. We miss your good financial contributions now. If we as a whole congregation do not succeed in increasing our regular income, we will have to apply in the fall for the pastoral position to be reduced to 25%. We are currently missing €1700.00 per month.


